### World-class properties and office space

**VRTGO Labs**, based on the Gateshead Quays, was the first UK VR industry-led centre of excellence, producing cutting edge VR and AR technology. Companies that are part of the VRTGO network work with leading brands such as Audi, PlayStation and Oculus.

**Northern Design Centre** is a hub for design innovation and product development in the region. It provides incubation space and studios for new and growing businesses.

**Sunderland Software Centre** is home to a number of games developers and software development companies. The centre supports the growth of the North East technology sector by providing business support and creating opportunities for aspiring and established software businesses.

**Ubisoft, the world's third largest producer of video games, employs 220 people at its Newcastle development studio and a further 150 at its EMEA customer relationship centre. Staff come from 27 different countries and speak 16 languages.**



### Unbeatable skills availability

North East England has nearly 15,000 employees working in creative industries and has the highest proportion of students studying STEM subjects in the UK. The region offers a large talent pool of graduates with all five universities offering bespoke courses aimed at the games industry, including Computer Games and Visual Effects (Northumbria University), Game Technologies (Newcastle University) and Serious Games and Virtual Environments (Durham University).

### Cost savings

Not only is the North East workforce loyal but it is one the least expensive locations in Europe to hire video gaming and creative staff. The typical cost savings of a video game designer in North East England are 25% less compared to London and over 10% less compared to Brighton, East of England and the South East. Compared to many European locations like Paris and Berlin, costs are over 40% lower.

Property costs are one-fifth of London, 47% lower than in Dublin, 29 % lower than Manchester and 25% lower than in Brighton. According to the Financial Times Benchmarking Study, a 25 person video games operation in the North East would save over £1 million per annum in costs compared to London per annum.
